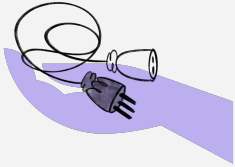

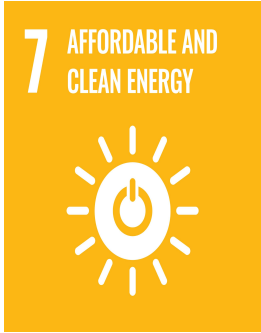

Through the village restoration project we strive to look after end to end maintenance of the village.

The anonymous Indian Charitable Trust (TAICT) is focussed on issues relating to the environment, governance, and livelihood, as a means to improve the everyday lives of citizens.

TAICT looks to address basic issues of the environment, health and hygiene through simple, practical solutions.

The **EcoGram project** is an initiative by TAICT with the objective of improving soil, waste, and water management within the Bettahalasur Gram Panchayat area.

Tarahunise Lake

Tarahunise Lake

The lake, which has been mostly dry for the last 30 years, has an area of 32 acres and a holding capacity of 187 million litres.

Our main focus areas for the lake restoration were

- Beautification
- Upgradation
- Maintenance

Progress so far

- Planted around 289 tree saplings and other pollinator friendly flora for **biodiversity enhancement**.
- Beautified lake area, **attracting more wildlife**, including endangered species like painted storks and Alexandrine parakeets.
- **Installed 31 floating wetlands**, reducing nitrate levels in water by 72.7% (positively contributed to fish species observed).
- Conducted Biodiversity Study- Revealed 3,272 organisms, a testament to the sheer vitality and abundance of life within the ecosystem.
- Established lake maintenance system for monitoring, clean-ups, and sapling care.

There were no parks at the lake when I first moved here, but now, there's a new butterfly park, which I am very happy to see. All the plants in the park have name plates and the park is maintained well. The environment here, including the air, is very clean. The best time to go to the lake is in the morning or evening. There are benches as well. You can walk around the lake and even sit and enjoy.

As a farmer, my lands are adjacent to the lake. I have never seen this lake full of water since I was born. Our borewells are refreshed to a depth of 120 to 300 feet, and I receive a 12-hour continuous yield following the government, WeWork India and EcoGram Team's combined efforts to rejuvenate and maintain the lake. We are so grateful for this. They have also built a track around the lake for our tractors so we are able to get to our farms with ease.

For the past two years, I have run fishing operations at Tarahunise Lake. What truly makes me proud, is that I am able to run my business here without harming any other species. These days, I also provide boat services to to prune aquatic weeds, and coordinate to clean up the lake bed.

Voices from the community



"Since EcoGram and WeWork India's efforts to restore the lake, the **ecosystem** has become conducive for waders due to ethical fishing practices. The lake now has a diverse range of fish species, and birds such as **Cormorants, Darters, and three species of Kingfishers**, making it their home. It is also a habitat for **near-threatened** species like the **Alexandrine Parakeet, Painted Stork, and Oriental Darter**. Recently, there have been rare bird sightings including the **Striated Heron and common Cuckoo**. Beyond birds, the lake now teems with a vibrant macro world, featuring colorful inhabitants like the crimson rose butterfly, common Jezebel, and other insects, including the Indian jumping ant."

What your contribution can help us achieve

- Further **strengthen the bund** on the east side of the lake to address heavy water movement, to **prevent rapid erosion and challenges for repair**.
- **Building a robust wetland** to ensure high water quality.
 - The influx of untreated sewage from nearby plots contaminates the lake, endangering aquatic ecosystems and compromising the purity of groundwater, posing potential health risks to local residents.
- Undertake **engineering initiatives** to address issues related to the inlets and outlets of the lake, mitigating water stagnation and flood risks.
- **Constructing restroom facilities** to serve the needs of both the local community and visitors to the lake
- **Installation of solar lamps** for increased safety for visitors of the lake.



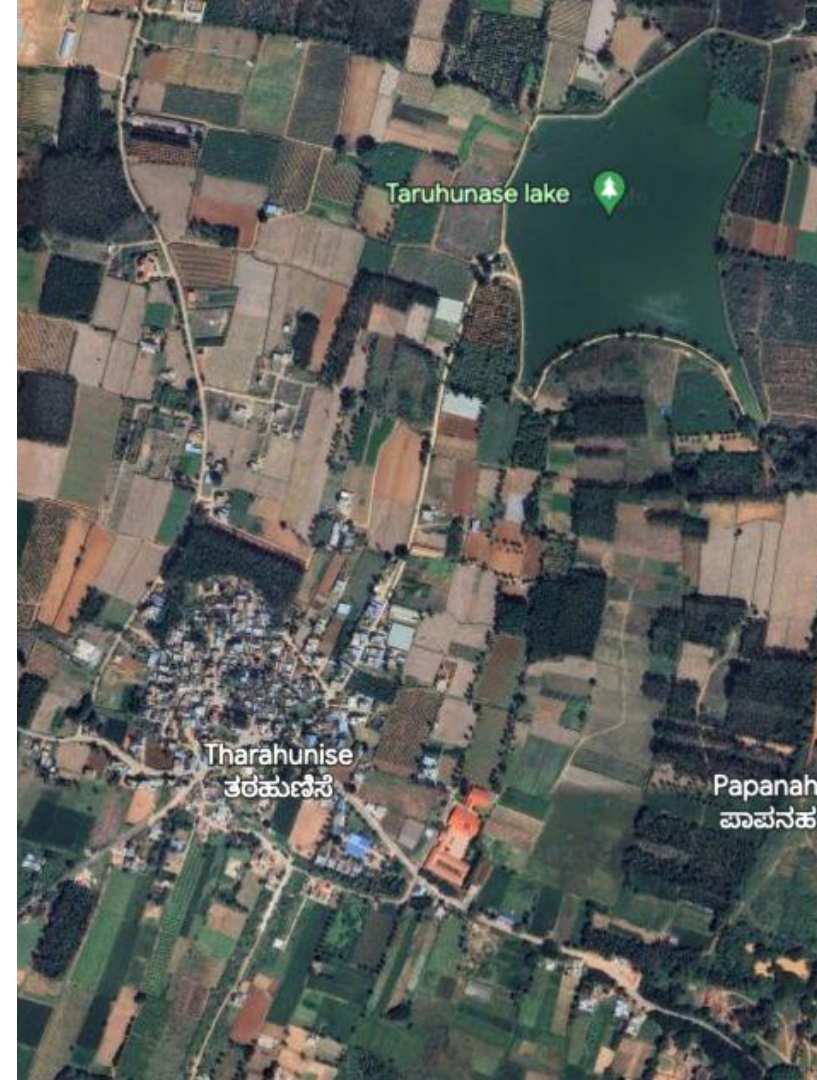

Tarahunise Village

Tarahunise Village Adoption

- Population - 1672 Residents approx
- Total waste generators - 486

Scope of work

- Daily data collection to assess **13 key performance indicators**.
- Conduct research, hold **events and awareness campaigns** around waste management and water conservation.
- Processing of all organic waste collected into compost at waste collection centre.

Community

- Creation of **EcoGram Shakti Sisterhood** as custodians of the program.
- **Tailoring skill development program** 'Threads of Life' for the women.
- **Trashonomics workshop** roll out for schools.
- Creating **menstruation awareness**.

Outputs

- Observable **cleanliness** on the streets
- Use and **maintenance** of litter bins
- Bring an end to burning rubbish on roadsides.



Progress so far

- Segregation at source is currently at **92%** for villages and **90%** for bulk generators, participation level is at **83%**.
- Successful implementation of SWM violation fines and penalties as per Karnataka Panchayat Raj (Management of Solid Waste).
- Introduction of SWM user fees.
- Visual cleanliness: **Hosted 73 clean up drives and collected a total of 2776 kgs of waste.**

Community outreach

- Since adoption, **44 ladies successfully graduated** from the 'Threads of Life' tailoring skill development program.
- Hosted wide variety of **upskilling & health awareness workshops** with Shakti Sisterhood.
- Conducted **SWM awareness/ Trashonomics workshops** with 121 students.

- Continue to **reinforce ethical and sustainable waste management** practices.
- Setting up entrance boards in the village.
- Implementing **Trashonomics workshops** for school children to expand our outreach and promote environmental education.
- Upscaling the '**Threads of Life**' program which will contribute to women empowerment and upskilling
- Providing **sponsorship** for sewing machines.
- Conducting **graduation ceremonies** for students of the 'Threads of Life' program.

The Sanjay Gandhi National Park (SGNP) in Mumbai is a unique protected area where leopards exist in a forest right in the heart of the city. Mumbai's case study serves as an example of adaptability where leopards cohabitate amongst people.

WCS-India's overarching goal is the protection and conservation of the natural environment, its flora and fauna, and in particular the preservation of wildlife and ecosystems in India.

Together, we strive to create a safe environment for both leopards and the local community, **fostering mutual understanding and respect between humans and wildlife.**

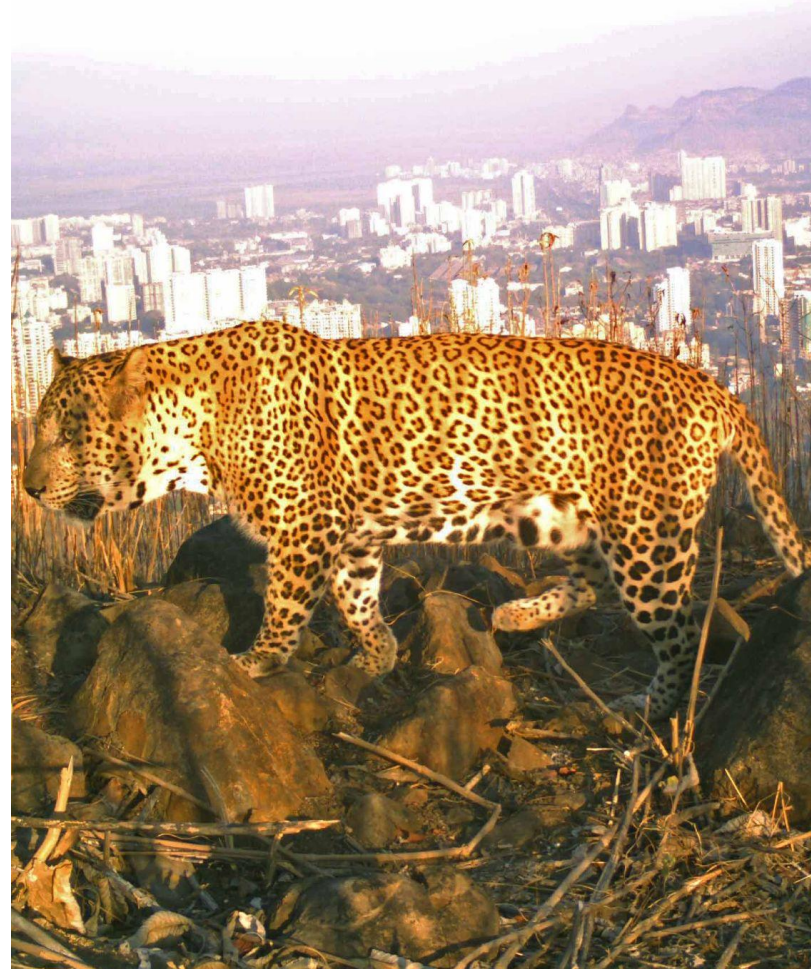

Progress so far

- The project showcases progress in **leopard identity profiling**, contributing to a **holistic approach to wildlife conservation and community education**.
- Set up trap cameras in over **49 locations** around SGNP.
- WCS was able to do identity **profiling of at least 52 leopards**.
- Awareness **workshops and stakeholder engagement initiatives** were executed to contribute to a harmonious living environment.
- **Social surveys** have been conducted to gather data that contributes to anthropological research.
- On the 15th of February, we started with Block One of camera trapping in Tungareshwar Wildlife Sanctuary further expanding our area for tracking leopards
- We started block two of camera trapping in the Southern Range on 13th March.

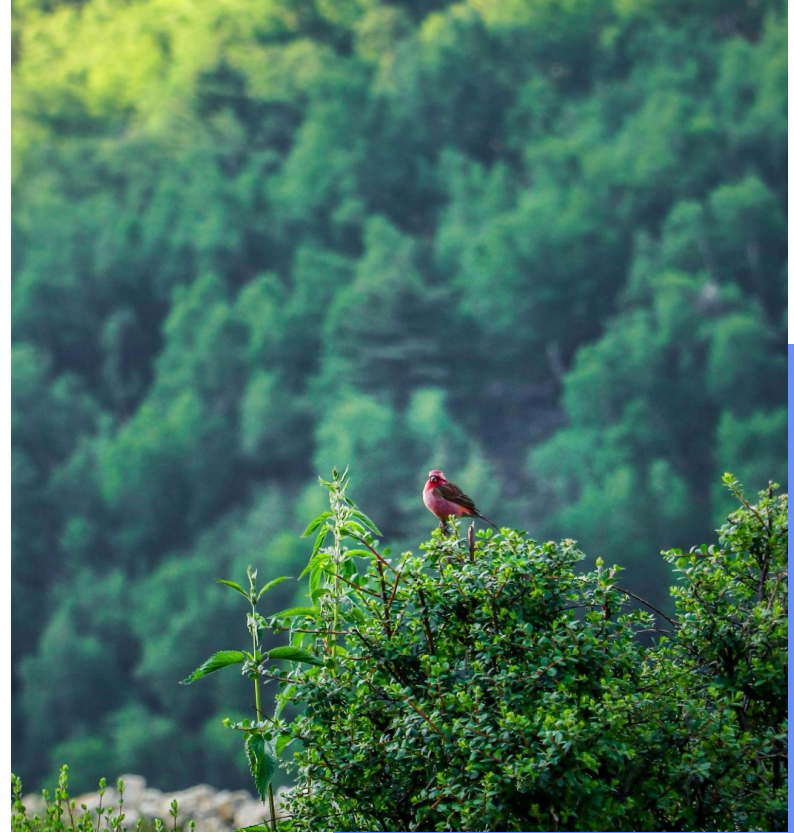

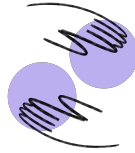

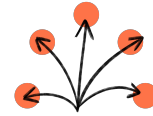
